



## OPEN CALL UNDER ERASMUS+ (KA131 2021) FOR STUDENT MOBILITY AT BLENDED INTENSIVE PROGRAMS Possibilities of cofinancing the Erasmus+ KA131 BIP mobility

Students can receive funding for the duration of the physical part of the mobility. The Erasmus+ KA131 co-financing possibilities for participation at the Blended Intensive Program (BIP) mobility for the project year 2021 are as follows:

## students with fewer opportunities

<u>In addition to basic Erasmus+ grants, students with fewer opportunities will be able to receive additional support for inclusion</u>. The conditions for entitlement to the inclusion allowance are:

- that the student receives a state scholarship or
- that the student is a member of a family where one of the children or parents has a CSD / ZZZS / ZRSŠ decision, or
- that the student has the decision of ZRSŠ / CSD / ZZZS (for companion, adjustment of lessons, disability, etc.) or
- that the student comes from a single-parent or foster family

The student has the possibility to select this option in the online application and add relevant supporting documents. In the case of foreign students, they must submit other relevant documents proving that they are a student with fewer opportunities.

Students with fewer opportunities, in addition to basic Erasmus+ grants as stated in section 1 above, can receive <u>additional support</u> <u>for inclusion</u>:

As well, in addition to the Erasmus+ basic grants from point 1, they can receive support for travel costs in the following amount:

|   | Participants who are entitled to a support for travel costs may, in exceptional cases, receive support for extraordinary costs for expensive travel. Financial support for the high travel costs of participants may be granted if these costs are well justified. In order to obtain funding, the following conditions should be fulfilled:  - the participant can apply for up to 80% of all eligible costs,  - the normal funding rule (based on unit costs per distance range) does not cover at least 70% of participants' travel costs. If grant are awarded to cover extraordinary costs for expensive travel, they replace support for travel costs as stated above. |                       |   |  |

| 3- Additional<br>funding for<br>students with<br>special needs <sup>3</sup>   | Students with the status of a person with special needs will be able to apply for additional funding, which will be allocated according to the individually approved eligible actual costs, following UP's call for Erasmus + EU grants.   |                       |   |  |

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup> Persons with special needs include individuals who need to implement programs with additional professional assistance or with adjustments according to the nature of the specific special need. Students with special needs are: blind or partially sighted students or students with visual impairment, deaf and hard of hearing students, students with speech and language disorders, physically challenged students, long-term ill students, students with autistic disorders and students with emotional and behavioral disorders. Additionally, in addition to Erasmus+ EU grants, students who meet the conditions set by the Public Scholarship, Development, Disability and Maintenance Fund of the Republic of Slovenia will be able to obtain additional funds approved to the University of Primorska. In the project year 2021, this is 67,76 € /month.

The implementation of the Erasmus+ program at UP is linked to the project activities of various active projects, which, depending on the approved available funds, enable co-financing of students selected to participate in mobility within the Erasmus+ KA131 project. The University of Primorska, as the contractor of this Call, reserves the right to change or supplement the conditions of co-financing. In the event of changes, all selected candidates will be duly informed.

It is important to be aware that Erasmus+ co-finances the costs of studying abroad and does not cover the costs in full. The amount of the awarded funding will be defined in the Erasmus+ Grant Agreement, which will be signed by the student with UP after the submission of the application documentation.

A student receiving an Erasmus+ EU grant continues to be eligible for other regional, national or other grants not managed by a national agency but by another organization (eg ministry or regional authorities).
